Canoes were often the most valuable property of the Arawak tribes. These wooden vessels were the only means of transport between the islands and along the rugged coastlines. Fishing and trading would have been impossible without them.

When building a canoe, the men of the village would look among the tall forest trees for one tall and stout enough to build a canoe. They knew which woods were hard and which were soft, which timbers were best for caring and stretching. When they had agreed on a particular tree the men set about felling it. Serving Size

This tells us what is considered one serving of the product. Every other nutrient on the label is based on this amount.

Calories

Calories are a unit of energy.
Catories in food come from carbohydrate, protein and fat.
Because calories give us energy, we need them to be able to think and play.

% Daily Value

This tells you the percentage of the daily value you are getting, which is the recommended amount of a nutrient you need per day. A food that has more than 20% of the Daily Value of a certain nutrient is a good source of that nutrient.

Cholesterol

Cholesterol is only found in animal products. You should avoid eating too much cholesterol, especially if your blood is high in cholesterol.

Total Carbohydrate

Carbohydrates give your muscles and brain energy. Certain types of carbohydrates are sometimes list on the label: Fiber: This helps with digestion and keeps you full between meals.

Sugars: This is important for instant energy, but eating too much can be unhealthy.

Protein

This nutrient is used to build muscle and fight infections. Teen girls usually need around 60 grams of protein each day.

Vitamins/Minerals

This tells you the percent daily value for Vitamin A, Vitamin C, Calcium, and Iron you are getting from this product. Other vitamins and manerals may be included in this section.












